## University community shares concern for welfare of missing woman

The University of Tasmania shares deep concerns for the welfare of Natasha Narang and is monitoring the situation closely, according to Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Students and Education) Professor David Sadler.

Police have issued a public appeal for information about the whereabouts of Ms Narang – an international PhD student - who was last seen in CCTV footage on the University's Newnham campus about 2.05pm.

"We would simply urge Natasha to contact her family or police," Professor Sadler said.

"Staff worked in co-operation with Tasmanian Police during the weekend and we continue to do everything within our power to assist efforts to locate Natasha."

He urged anyone with any information, no matter how seemingly inconsequential, to contact Crimestoppers on 1800 333 000 or Launceston police on 6336 3945.

The University is in contact with and has offered support to Ms Narang's husband.
