The economics of fish: 2007 Giblin Lecture

University of Queensland Professor of Economics, Prof Harry Campbell, will deliver this year's free Giblin Lecture at the University of Tasmania, on the topic of *Economics, Property Rights and Fishery Management*.

Prof Campbell was formerly Professor of Economics at UTAS and has held academic positions at various universities in Canada, Australia and Europe. His main research interest has been fisheries economics and he is a past-President of the International Institute of Fisheries Economics and Trade. He has published over 50 papers in academic journals as well as books and numerous research reports.

The annual Giblin lecture, hosted by the School of Economics and Finance, and the Economics Society of Australia (Tasmania branch), attracts a series of high-profile speakers, including Professor Allan Fels and former Reserve Bank chairman Ian McFarlane, with a strong turnout from business, government and those with an interest in economics.

The series is named for one of Tasmania's leading economists, Prof Lyndhurst Faulkner Giblin (1872-1951).
