New exhibition to unravel raw emotion

The latest exhibition at the UTAS Cradle Coast Campus Atrium Gallery, *Unravelling*, features powerful images charged with the raw emotion of women's mental health issues.

The collection of 13 large, figurative charcoal drawings by Ulverstone artist Louise Daniels, featured recently in a highly successful exhibition at the Brunswick Street Gallery in Melbourne.

"My figures represent the many women living in North West Tasmania, dealing with the burden of change and uncertainty," Ms Daniels explained.

"Most of these women are fighting back, gradually wresting some control and freeing themselves from binding pressures. Unfortunately, some women have nothing left and are slowly unravelling, falling apart...the job is too hard."

The opening address for this exhibition will be presented by Dr Ross Lamplugh who is the co-founder, owner and chairman of the Ochre Health Group, and sessional lecturer at the Rural Clinical School, UTAS.
