National Centre for Maritime Engineering and Hydrodynamics (NCMEH) lecturer Dr Christopher Chin has beaten thousands of nominees to be named Australia's Lecturer of the Year.

The award, now in its sixth year, is an initiative of UniJobs.com.au, and aims to reward the efforts of diligent academic staff that have helped enrich the lives of students and work colleagues.

More than 100,000 votes were cast online in 2012, making it the most popular award to date.

Dr Chin is no stranger to the Lecturer of the Year award, securing third place in last year's rankings and second the year before.
