Classics of tomorrow showcased in exhibition

Innovative designs by college students will be showcased at a new exhibition to be officially opened tonight (**Wednesday 2 November**).

The exhibition *Future Classics* comprises of artwork created by the students during the Object Design course, which is a pilot design program for year 11 and 12 students.

Around 50 students from 14 Colleges have worked to produce an original object or garment in response to the brief to "Design a Future Classic".

The works are diverse and include furniture, garments, jewellery, powered technology and millinery.

Professor Stephen Loo, from the UTAS School of Architecture and Design, congratulated the students on their designs.

"Their calibre of the students' designs is very high and the freshness of their creativity is inspiring," Prof Loo said.

"It is wonderful to see the designs collected in the *Future Classics* exhibition and I extend my thanks to everyone involved in Object Design."
